



Super Simple Triangle Shawl

Size: Smaller size is 60" across at top (longest) edge and 24" deep from back neck to point. Larger size is 86" across and 36" deep. Of course you can always make it smaller or stop anywhere in between.

Materials: One half-hank of Mountain Colors' Wool Crepe for smaller size and a full hank for a larger size. Size 8 circular needle 24" or longer.

Gauge: Not too important, but somewhere around 4-4½ sts=1"



Directions: Cast on 3 stitches. Knit.

PATTERN ROW: Slip 1, Knit 1, Increase 1*, knit to end. Repeat every row until shawl reached desired size. (Leave a small ball of yarn to crochet around the edge if you like.) Bind off loosely. For edge, use a G or H crochet hook to work a row of backwards single crochet all the way around. Wash your shawl in some warm water and it will full a little and become softer.

***Use a M1 increase, or you can use a Y/O and then you'll have a little decorative row of holes at the edge.**

ABBREVIATIONS:

M1= Make 1 stitch by inserting left needle under the bar in between stitches from front to back and then knit the lifted strand through the back to twist it as you make a stitch. (You can also insert needle from back to front and knit into the front)

Y/O= yarn over (bring yarn in between and then over right hand needle)

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
